



## **2. SPRING APS MEETING AT COLUMBUS, OH, 18–21 APRIL 1998**

The 1998 APS Spring Meeting will be held in Columbus, OH, April 18–21, Friday through Monday. The Division of Nuclear Physics will organize five sessions of invited papers for the Spring Meeting. The 1997 Program Committee will arrange three sessions of invited papers on topics selected at their 5 October Whistler meeting. Suggestions for topics are welcome and should be sent with reasons for their choice to the 1997 Program Committee Chair, Stuart J. Freedman. Additional information such as proposed talks with names of possible speakers for “topical” sessions would also be useful. The remaining two sessions are selected by vote of the Program Committee from suggestions for individual speakers from the DNP membership. The composition of the “voted” sessions relies on the nominations from the entire DNP community; you are urged to participate in this process. The nomination form for individual speakers, which is included with this newsletter, should be mailed to Stuart J. Freedman as early as possible before the **10 October** deadline.

The Columbus meeting will provide an experimental test of a new general meeting format. Instead of joint sessions with other units, the early morning sessions will be of plenary format with general talks in the style of the very successful Tri-Divisional Colloquia, which W. Haxton has organized the past two years. The APS/AAPT Spring Meeting Program Committee agreed to try this DPF initiated proposal on a one-time trial prior to the break in spring meetings caused by the 1999 Centennial Meeting. Come and evaluate the experiment.

## **3. CALL FOR SPRING MEETING PLENARY SESSION SUGGESTIONS, B. C. Clark**

At its April 21st meeting the Program Committee for the APS/AAPT 1998 Spring meeting approved having three plenary sessions at 8:30 a.m. on the first three days of the meeting (April 18–20). In order to have the broadest possible input for these new plenary sessions we ask each of you to send suggestions for speakers and topics. This will form a good discussion of possible sessions at the next program committee meeting, 21 September.

One motivation for this new format is to engage more people in the excitement in all areas of physics. Talks on physics not generally included at the spring meeting, such as Condensed Matter Physics, Medical Physics, Environmental Physics, Biophysics, could be interesting candidates. Certainly, areas usually covered at the meeting are not exempt. Suggest the best and brightest for

consideration. The successful Tri-Divisional Colloquia at the last two spring meetings could easily serve as a model. Because these are Plenary Sessions and we seek to have a large number of people attend, we encourage you to suggest exceptional speakers and the most interesting “hot” topics.

The dates include the Wednesday “workshops,” which are held in conjunction with the DNP Fall Meetings. Holding “workshops” at the DNP Fall Meetings is a tradition that began with the 1986 Vancouver meeting. All meeting attendees are welcome and encouraged to come. It has been the intention of the DNP Executive Committees that these “workshops” should have broad appeal, with introductory pedagogical talks for the benefit of those who have come primarily for the DNP meeting but want to take the opportunity to learn about a field of specialty of the local community.

#### 5. NOMINATIONS FOR APS FELLOWSHIP

The procedure for the election of a Member to Fellowship is outlined in the Membership Directory of the APS under “Constitution and Bylaws.” A nomination form, which cites the principal contributions of the candidates to physics, should be prepared and signed by two members of the society. The total number of members who could be elected to Fellowship in a given year is one half of one percent of the total APS membership.

The DNP deadline is normally *1 April*. Nomination forms are available from Peggy Mendoza, The American Physical Society, One Physics Ellipse, College Park, MD 20740-3843. Completed forms should be returned to Dr. J. Franz at the same address.

It is particularly important for nominators to ensure that the cases which they prepare for the Fellowship Committee are well documented. In addition to that requested on the nomination form, information such as lists of invited talks, awards, professional activities, committee services, and participation in organization of conferences is very helpful. Inclusion of a complete publication list is highly recommended.

The DNP has adopted the following Fellowship Criteria Guidelines. To be chosen as a Fellow, an APS member should have a record of excellence in research that has been sustained over several years, and have done at least one major, original work that has influenced his/her specialty in a significant way.

The list of APS Fellows (by APS subunit) elected in a given year is published in the March issue of APS News. The names of newly elected DNP Fellows are published in the February DNP newsletter and the awards are presented at the DNP Business meeting of the Spring APS meeting.

The 1998 DNP Fellowship Committee is comprised of L. Riedinger (Chair), A. B. Balantekin, C. Glashauser, R. F. Casten, and S. J. Seestrom. The Fellowship Committee reviews the nominations for APS fellowship referred to the DNP and recommends a slate of candidates, which is forwarded to the DNP Executive Committee and then to APS Council for approval.

## 9. FALL 1997 TARGET DATES FOR PROPOSAL SUBMISSIONS TO THE DIVISION OF PHYSICS OF THE NSF, V. R. Brown

On the basis of the success of last year's target-date experiment, which was designed to improve the Division's management of proposals, and to allow us, where appropriate, to employ disciplinary panels in the merit review process, the Division of Physics will repeat the use of target dates for proposal submissions for disciplinary research activities competing for FY 1998 funds (FY 1998 begins on October 1, 1997).

The two target dates of interest to DNP members are:

1. Wednesday, October 8, for proposals concerning:  
Theoretical Nuclear Physics  
Special Programs and Conferences
2. Wednesday, November 19, for proposals concerning:  
Experimental Nuclear Physics

Please do not send proposals more than one month in advance of the deadline to avoid processing timing difficulties.

Other target dates in the Physics Division can be found on the NSF/Physics Division web pages "<http://www.nsf.gov/mps/phy>".

The above dates do not apply to proposals sent to the Physics Division in response to Foundation-wide solicitations such as the Faculty Early Career Development (CAREER) or Research Experiences for Undergraduates sites (REU).
